- 3. Report of Centennial Project Committee
 - L. B. Smith reported that Frank Friedrich, student at Beliveau Junior High School in St. Boniface had received the \$10.00 award at the Students Science Fair for his collection of Coleoptera and Lepidoptera. Recommendations were presented by L. B. Smith for future similar projects as follows:
 - To attract more students to work on entomology, publicity should be sent to the schools in the spring as well as the autumn to allow them to carry out studies in the summer months.
 - The prizes should be awarded in the junior high and elementary divisions principally since this is where the encouragement needed is. By the time the student reaches senior high school, his interests are fairly well established.

 If there were enough entomology exhibits, a separate competition could be organized for entomology. It would be still part of the Science Fair but separate from other biology projects.

Mention was made of a letter from E. J. La Roux, President of the E.S.C., offering a \$50.00 prize for Entomological displays or projects.

All in attendance were in favour of continuation of the project.

Report of Editor

- P, S. Barker reported that Volume 3 of the Manitoba Entomologist has been distributed to the membership, and a number of copies sent on exchange. Enough papers are on hand to launch Volume 4. The following recommendations were made by P. S. Barker.
- Society should have an Editorial Board consisting of three members.
